How To Be More Present And Mindful In Conversation

As healthcare volunteers, you will have conversations with patients, employees and guests of our facilities. Some conversations can be as easy as directing a patient to an appointment to as hard as trying to be supportive to a family during the loss of a loved one. No conversation has greater meaning than the other. They all reflect how our patients, visitors and coworkers feel about our organization. The more present and mindful you are, the more rewarding the conversation will be for all involved.

Here are some tips to be more present and mindful during conversations.

- Bring your mind back when it wanders the first step to being more mindful during a conversations is to notice when your mind is drifting.
- Avoid multitasking multitasking prevents us from fully committing to a conversation.
- Ask questions when you are asking questions, you are engaging with what the other person has to say.
- Read the other person's body language paying attention to body language can help you to understand how the other person is feeling and can help give you a better idea of how to respond.
- Keep eye contact maintaining eye contact shows the other person that you are interested in whey they have to say.
